Dumpsters will be located at the Street Garage on 303 Wise Road in Lynchburg. Participants must have a copy of their utility bill to utilize these dumpsters.

<u>No</u> refrigerators, AC's, batteries, or tires.

With the temperatures dropping, freezing pipes can be an issue during these cold months. You can take preventative measures inside, to help avoid this. Here's what you can do:

- Allow your faucets to drip. Even a trickle will help prevent freezing.
- Keep the thermostat consistent,

at the same temperature both during the day and night.

- Opening kitchen/bathroom cabinet doors will allow warmer air to circulate around plumbing, especially if your sinks are on an exterior wall.
- Seal up any cracks and holes to prevent drafts.
- For long term, consider adding insulation to attics, basements & crawl spaces.

Do not open meter pits during these cold temperatures. Doing so can cause the meter to freeze. These meters are for Village personnel use only.

SNOW REMOVAL REMINDERS:

DRIVEWAYS — An unavoidable result of plowing snow is a ridge of snow along the road and at the end of driveways. Our operators do what they can to minimize this when possible. You can help by piling the snow that you shovel off your driveway to the right side. (The side away from approaching traffic.)

CUL-DE-SACS — Cul-de-sacs pose challenges. Cul-de-sacs are difficult to plow and cause some other problems for road crews. If you live on a Cul-de-sac please **DO NOT** park at the end of it. Please leave the end open so snow can be plowed correctly.


Try to keep your vehicle off the street. If you must park on the street, park as close to the curb as possible.
