A Letter from the Mayor

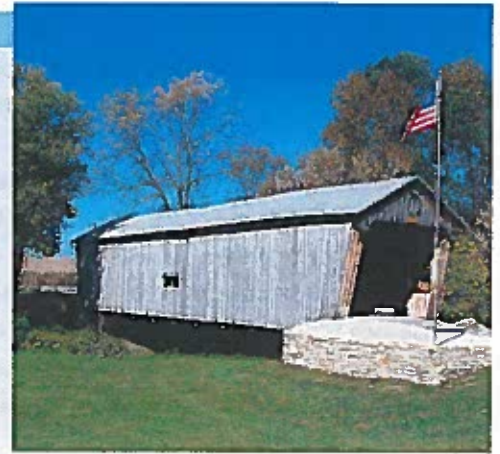

Throughout 2016, we have made significant changes. All that I feel are good for our small Village. We have sold 2 lots for a total of \$7,200.00. Sold all 3 police cruisers for a total of \$4,238.00. Ordinance 2009-2 An Ordinance to Prohibit Certain Nuisances in the Village

In recent weeks we have received several complaints in regards to unlicensed, junk, or disabled vehicles being parked and left on the streets. Please be advised that there is a Village Ordinance prohibiting this. If you have any of the above mentioned vehicles parked on the streets please be courteous and move these vehicles to private property. Failure to do so will result in enforcement of this ordinance.

Going forward, the Village Voice will be mailed out on a quarterly basis. If you would like to have anything published, the information for publishing must be received no later than the 15th of the month that Voice is scheduled to be distributed.
