## Water and Sewer Rate Update: Per Ordinance No. 2019-01 and Ordinance No. 2019-02, there will be a change in water and sewer rates. The Water Base Rate will be increased from \$25.97 to \$26.49. The Sewer Base Rate will be increased from \$37.87 to \$38.63. Beginning May 15-June 15th billing cycle, the new monthly base rates are as follows: 0-2000 gallons of Water - \$26.49 0-2000 gallons of Sewer - \$38.63 Trash (no change) - \$10.00 Water Debt Account (no change) - \$7.00 Total New Minimum Monthly Bill - <u>\$82.12</u> and the second We are proud to announce our new website: www.lynchburgohio.org

## Re: Ordinance 2013-6

Please cut and maintain your property to a height less than twelve inches. Your yard must be kept clear of tall or noxious plants, weeds, and/or grasses.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2019-05**

### AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT LEAVING YARD WASTE IN THE STREETS, GUTTERS AND DRAINAGE AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, Grass clippings and leaves blown into streets are not only an eyesore and a hazard to cyclists and motorists, but they also damage creeks and lakes, clog storm drains, cause flooding and increase maintenance costs. Rainwater collected in the street washes grass clippings, leaves and other debris into storm drains and then into neighborhood storm water conveyance systems. This material clogs up the drainage system. Since storm water is not treated, it flows directly to local creeks and waterways where it decays, using up oxygen and releasing nutrients that feed algal blooms, killing fish and other wildlife. For these and other reasons, the Village prohibits leaving yard waste in the street.

Whereas, there are simple ways to maintain attractive landscaped without casting yard waste into the street: Leave grass clippings on the lawn (they are fertilizer). Direct mowers to cast clippings away from pavements where possible. Sweep or blow clippings off of pavements and back onto the lawn. Mix grass clippings with leaves and soil to make compost, a soil conditioner. Properly prepare leaves and other yard waste for curbside pickup by the trash removal contractor.

Now, therefore, be it ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Lynchburg, State of Ohio, that

**SECTION ONE:** These is hereby enacted Section 93.50 as a supplement to the Ohio Basic Code adopted by the Village:

#### \$93.50 DISCARDING YARD WASTER IN STREET AND DRAINAGE.

"Yard waste" means solid waste that includes leaves, grass clippings, brush, garden waste, tree trunks, tree stumps, holiday trees, and pruning from trees or shrubs and similar vegetative waste.

- No property owner, tenant, contractor or equipment operator shall suffer or permit yard waste from a property under his or her control to be discarded onto a public street, alleyway gutter or drainage pipe opening or drainage ditch in the Village.
- Whoever violates this section is guilty of a fourth degree misdemeanor, and the first \$25 dollars of any fine imposed therefor shall not be suspended. Any court enforcing this section, may accept a bond forfeiture covering the minimum fine and the court costs, provided no prior violations have been cited under this section for the property in violation.
- It shall be an affirmative defense to an offense under this section (1) that the yard waste was deposited by an act of God or separate criminal agency, (2) that the yard waste was temporarily placed illegally in the ordinary course of performing grounds maintenance with timely removal immediately following the maintenance work, (3) the amount of yard waste is inconsequential or extremely small, (4) the property owner obtained a prior waiver from the Village Administrator based upon a showing of good cause, or (5) the placement of the yard waste was necessary to prevent an even greater hazard to the public.

**SECTION TWO**: This ORDINANCE shall be declared an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health and welfare and for the reason that immediate action is needed to prevent damage to drainage in the Village, therefore, this legislation shall have immediate effect at the earliest time allowed by law.


