### Please, do not block waterways!

Open ditch drainage is a long narrow trench or furrow dug in the ground for irrigation, drainage or a boundary line. It is present at the front, along the side or at the rear of a property. Open ditching may look like a "low spot" in your yard, but it serves a very important role in ensuring water moves away from your home. This gently sloped area, lower than the surrounding land, allows excess rain water to flow freely and to be drained away from yards, crawl spaces or basements. This environmentally friendly drainage method, also allows the surrounding grassy area, shrubs and trees to absorb the water they need, while the rest flows down the open ditch.

Please do not block or change the ditching as it can cause overflows in certain areas.



Average annual energy bill





### 15 Ways to Save Money on

### This summer

- Check your air ducts for leaks 1.
- 2. Replace your air filters regularly
- 3. Make sure your vents are actually open
- 4. Use the "Energy Saver" option on your AC
- 5. Instead of turning off your AC during the day, cut the temperature back 7-10%. (Your AC won't have to work as hard to cool your house back down)
- 6. Consider investing in a programmable thermostat
- 7. Only run full loads when using your large appliances (washer, dryer, dishwasher)
- 8. Use appliances in off-peak hours if you can (usually after 8PM)
- Do your laundry in cold water (it won't 9. damage your clothes like you think it will)
- 10. Try sun drying your clothes instead of using the dryer
- 11. Skip the heated dry cycle on your dishwasher
- 12. Use power strips and shut them off when you aren't using what's plugged in
- 13. Keep your curtains closed (reduces incoming heat by up to 30%)
- Install awnings on south and west facing windows
- 15. Consider installing window AC units in bedrooms so you only have to cool the bedrooms at night, instead of the whole house.
