


### Lynchburg, Ohio

Streets, sidewalks, and other public right-of-ways are for everyone's use. Property owners are responsible for their trees and all other vegetation in the public right-of-way next to their property. Overgrown vegetation is a safety hazard and limits the use of sidewalks, trails, streets and alleys. It further threatens public safety when vegetation blocks the view of traffic signs, signals, vehicles, or cyclists.

Trimming vegetation and caring for your trees and shrubs are effective ways residents can enhance neighborhood safety.

- Within the month of November, The Village of Lynchburg will address trees and overgrown vegetation that are found to be within the portion of the road or alleyway (approximately 2' on each side).
- Residents that have ornamental trees or shrubs within the streets or alleyways need to remove or relocate them as soon as possible.

#### **LEAF PICKUP**

#### October 21st - November 22nd

- Leaves must be placed at the curb or roadside before each pickup day.
  - We will not go into any yards to collect them.
- Please do not put limbs, sticks, rocks, trash, or any debris in the leaf piles.

<u>Please note</u>: There will not be any particular-set schedule, the leaves will be picked up throughout the month.

As a reminder: Please do not burn leaves within the Villages
Corporation Limit. Burning leaves within the Village Limits is illegal.
If caught doing so, violations can result in substantial penalties.
