Significant changes were accomplished during the four years Terry Burden served as Mayor. Terry did a wonderful job and took Lynchburg through some major positive projects, including.

The new Veterans Memorial at Agnes Park, along with the Memorial Day Picnic.

New Police Levy was passed. Two new Welcome signs on State Route 134. Repainting of our downtown buildings in historical colors. Installed the Bell Tower. Planted flowers at Old School Park, along with adding new mulch to the playground. Flower baskets throughout downtown. Many new trees were planted. The Police Station was remodeled. 
We appreciate his dedication and commitment to the Village of Lynchburg. We wish him well in any endeavors he may pursue.

Frozen Pipes



• Turn off the water to outside faucets



• Close outside vents, crawl spaces and doors



Repair broken windows and seal any cracks in the walls



 If you plan to be away - keep the heat on in the house and have a friend check on it for you while you are away



 Keep utility room and basement doors and cabinets open to make sure they are heated

WINTER DRIVING PREPAREDNESS



Inspect fluid levels, tires and battery.

If your vehicle is parked outside, allow enough time for it to warm up. Clear frost from all windows.




Keep your gas tank at least half full.
