An Update From The Mayor

Dear Village of Lynchburg,

It is my pleasure to share exciting news with you about our Covered Bridge. The Village has received 1.3 million in Grant funding to restore the Bridge. These funds consist of 950k tap monies from Ohio Department of Transportation and 350k capital budget monies from the State of Ohio. This rehabilitation will include: replacement of the roof, truss members, decking, siding, cameras, reset of abutment & pier stones, and more.

I want to acknowledge the historic nature of the Covered Bridge. These plans will repair the structure while maintaining the historical integrity. Select portions will be preserved and reused to contribute to it's authenticity. There will not be any metal beams or trusses used as all will be replaced with timber. The Bridge will be able to accommodate vehicles, though it will not be open for daily vehicular traffic. The projected completion date is Fall of 2022. The Covered Bridge will be enjoyed and admired for generations to come!

As always, I welcome you to share ideas and any concerns with me. I remain committed to working with the dedicated Village Employees, Village Council, Residents, and Business owners. I am grateful for the caring community which I am fortunate to serve and be a part of. Thank you for your continued support as we strive to maintain our small town charm, improve the future, and move forward together.

Per Ordinance No.2021-09; passed on 12/9/2021 and effective after 30 days following public notice, the new trash rate is \$13.25 per month.

This was due to an increase in the Village's contract with Rumpke. When the contract expires, the Village will be accepting new bids for the trash service.



All trash must be bagged & contained and placed in a garbage receptacle or trash can.


